FINDINGS AND DECISION

On May 18, 2004, the Superintendent of Police filed charges with the Police Board of the City of Chicago against Police Officer Victoria Richards, Star No. 16546 (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Respondent"), for violating the following rules:

- Rule 2: Any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department.
- Rule 6: Disobedience of an order or directive, whether written or oral.
- Rule 23: Failure to obey Department orders concerning other employment, occupation or profession.

The Police Board of the City of Chicago investigated these charges and caused a hearing on these charges against Police Officer Victoria Richards, Star No. 16546, to be had before Thomas E. Johnson, Hearing Officer of the Police Board of the City of Chicago, on October 14, 2004, October 15, 2004, and November 5, 2004.

Following the hearing, the members of the Police Board read and reviewed the certified transcription of the proceedings of the hearing and viewed the videotape of the hearing. Thomas E. Johnson, Hearing Officer, made an oral report and conferred with the Police Board before it rendered a decision.

The Police Board of the City of Chicago, as a result of its investigation of the charges, found and determined that:

- 1. The Respondent was at all times employed as a police officer by the Department of Police of the City of Chicago.
- 2. The charges were filed in writing and a Notice, stating the time, date and place, when and where a hearing of the charges was to be held, together with a copy of the original charges, was served upon the Respondent more than five (5) days prior to the hearing on the charges.
- 3. The hearing was conducted before Thomas E. Johnson, Hearing Officer of the Police Board of the City of Chicago, on October 14, 2004, October 15, 2004, and November 5, 2004.
- 4. Throughout the hearing, Police Officer Victoria Richards, Star No. 16546, was present and represented by counsel.
- 5. The Respondent Police Officer Victoria Richards, Star No. 16546, charged herein, contrary to the Rules and Regulations, is quilty of violating to wit:

Rule 2: Any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department, in that:

Count I: From on or about 24 April 2000 through and including 24 May 2000, or for some period of time therein, Police Officer Richards engaged in secondary employment at the Chicago Board of Education while on the medical roll of the Chicago Police Department.

Count II: From on or about 10 January 2001 through and including 27 March 2001, or for some period of time therein, Police Officer Richards engaged

in secondary employment at the Chicago Board of Education while on the medical roll of the Chicago Police Department.

Rule 6: Disobedience of an order or directive, whether written or oral, in that:

Count I:

From on or about 24 April 2000 through and including 24 May 2000, or for some period of time therein, Police Officer Richards engaged in secondary employment at the Chicago Board of Education while on the medical roll of the Chicago Police Department, thereby violating General Order 89-8-IV-K.

Count II:

From on or about 10 January 2001 through and including 27 March 2001, or for some period of time therein, Police Officer Richards engaged in secondary employment at the Chicago Board of Education while on the medical roll of the Chicago Police Department, thereby violating General Order 89-8-IV-K.

Rule 23: Failure to obey Department orders concerning other employment, occupation or profession, in that:

Count I:

From on or about 24 April 2000 through and including 24 May 2000, or for some period of time therein, Police Officer Richards engaged in secondary employment at the Chicago Board of Education while on the medical roll of the Chicago Police Department.

Count II:

From on or about 10 January 2001 through and including 27 March 2001, or for some period of time therein, Police Officer Richards engaged in secondary employment at the Chicago Board of Education while on the medical roll of the Chicago Police Department.

By reason of the findings of fact, the Respondent is **guilty** of violating Rules 2, 6, and 23.


