## FINDINGS AND DECISION

On August 19, 2004, the Superintendent of Police filed charges with the Police Board of the City of Chicago against Police Officer Bill Caro, Star #3128, (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Respondent") seeking his discharge for violating the following Rules:

Rule 2: Any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department.

Rule 3: Any failure to promote the Department's efforts to implement its policy or accomplish its goals.

Rule 5: Failure to perform any duty.

Rule 6: Disobedience of an order or directive, whether
written or oral.

Rule 10: Inattention to duty.

Rule 16: Entering any tavern or bar while on duty or in uniform, except in the performance of a police duty.

The Police Board of the City of Chicago caused a hearing on these charges against Police Officer Bill Caro to be had before Michael G. Berland, Hearing Officer of the Police Board of the City of Chicago, on March 16, 2005, April 14, 2005, and May 17, 2005.

Following the hearing, the members of the Police Board read and reviewed the certified transcription of the proceedings of the hearing and reviewed the videotapes of the hearing. Michael G. Berland, Hearing Officer, made an oral report and conferred with the Police Board before it rendered a decision.

The Police Board of the City of Chicago, as a result of its investigation of the charges, finds and determines that:

- 1. The Respondent was at all times a police officer employed by the Department of Police of the City of Chicago.
- 2. The charges were filed in writing and a Notice, stating the time, date, and place, when and where a hearing of the charges was to be held, together with a copy of the original charges, was served upon the Respondent more than five (5) days prior to the hearing on the charges.
- 3. The hearing was conducted on March 16, 2005, April 14, 2005, and May 17, 2005 before Michael G. Berland, Hearing Officer of the Police Board of the City of Chicago.
- 4. Throughout the hearing, the Respondent did appear in person and was represented by counsel of his choice.
- 5. The Respondent, Police Officer Bill Caro, Star #3128, charged herein, contrary to the Rules and Regulations, is **guilty** of violating, to wit:
  - Rule 2: Any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department.

- Count I: From about May 1, 2002, through about May 3, 2002, Police Officer Bill Caro operated an unlicenced security guard business, known as Bill Caro and Associates, thereby impeding the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals and/or bringing discredit upon the Department.
- Count II: From about November 10, 2001, through about November 12, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro operated a private security guard business while on duty, thereby impeding the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals and/or bringing discredit upon the Department.
- Count III: From about November 10, 2001, through about November 12, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro failed to adequately perform his duties as a Field Training Officer, thereby impeding the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals and/or bringing discredit upon the Department.
- 6. The Respondent, Police Officer Bill Caro, Star #3128, charged herein, contrary to the Rules and Regulations, is **guilty** of violating, to wit:
  - Rule 3: Any failure to promote the Department's efforts to implement its policy or accomplish its goals.
    - Count I: From about May 1, 2002, through about May 3, 2002, Police Officer Bill Caro operated an private security guard business while on duty, thereby failing to promote the Department's efforts to implement its policy or accomplish its goals.
    - Count II: On or about November 10, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro, while on duty, went to Las Tres Rosas Tavern, 3253 West Cermak Road, Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of operating his security guard business, while responsible for the training of Probationary Police Officer Virginia Chentis, thereby failing to

promote the Department's efforts to implement its policy or accomplish its goals.

Count III: On or about November 11, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro, while on duty, went to Las Tres Rosas Tavern, 3253 West Cermak Road, Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of operating his security guard business, while responsible for the training of Probationary Police Officer Virginia Chentis, thereby failing to promote the Department's efforts to implement its policy or accomplish its goals.

Count IV: On or about November 11, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro, while on duty, went to Western Stages Tavern, 1853 South Western Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of operating his security guard business, while responsible for the training of Probationary Police Officer Virginia Chentis, thereby failing to promote the Department's efforts to implement its policy or accomplish its goals.

Count V: On or about November 12, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro, while on duty, went to Las Tres Rosas Tavern, 3253 West Cermak Road, Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of operating his security guard business, while responsible for the training of Probationary Police Officer Virginia Chentis, thereby failing to promote the Department's efforts to implement its policy or accomplish its goals.

7. The Respondent, Police Officer Bill Caro, Star #3128, charged herein, contrary to the Rules and Regulations, is **guilty** of violating, to wit:

Rule 5: Failure to perform any duty.

Count I: On or about November 10, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro, while on duty, operated his security guard business, thereby failing to perform the duty of properly training Probationary Police Officer Virginia Chentis.

Count II: On or about November 11, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro, while on duty, operated his security guard business, thereby failing to perform the duty of properly training Probationary Police Officer Virginia Chentis.

Count III: On or about November 12, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro, while on duty, operated his security guard business, thereby failing to perform the duty of properly training Probationary Police Officer Virginia Chentis.

8. The Respondent, Police Officer Bill Caro, Star #3128, charged herein, contrary to the Rules and Regulations, is **guilty** of violating, to wit:

Count I: On or about May 3, 2002, Police Officer Bill Caro failed to obey a direct order given to him on May 1, 2002 by Sergeant Louis Velez, Star #1749, to stop operating an unlicenced security guard business, in that Police Officer Caro engaged in actions including, but not limited to, supplying security guards to Krista Liney of Indigo Productions, at or near George's Record Store, 3915 West Roosevelt Road, thereby disobeying an order or directive, whether written or oral.

9. The Respondent, Police Officer Bill Caro, Star #3128, charged herein, contrary to the Rules and Regulations, is guilty of violating, to wit:

Rule 10: Inattention to duty.

Count I: On or about November 10, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro, while on duty, went to Las Tres Rosas Tavern, 3253 West Cermak Road, Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of operating his security guard business, thereby being inattentive to duty.

Count II: On or about November 11, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro, while on duty, went to Las Tres Rosas Tavern, 3253 West Cermak Road, Chicago, Illinois, and/or left Probationary Police Officer Virginia Chentis unattended for approximately ten minutes, for the purpose of operating his security guard business, thereby being inattentive to duty.

Count III: On or about November 11, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro, while on duty, went to Western Stages Tavern, 1853 South Western Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of operating his security guard business, thereby being inattentive to duty.

Count IV: On or about November 12, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro, while on duty, went to Las Tres Rosas Tavern, 3253 West Cermak Road, Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of operating his security guard business, thereby being inattentive to duty.

10. The Respondent, Police Officer Bill Caro, Star #3128, charged herein, contrary to the Rules and Regulations, is **guilty** of violating, to wit:

Rule 16: Entering any tavern or bar while on duty or in uniform, except in the performance of a police duty.

Count I: On or about November 10, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro, while on duty and for no police purpose, entered Las Tres Rosas Tavern, 3253 West Cermak Road, Chicago, Illinois, thereby entering any tavern or bar while on duty and/or in uniform.

Count II: On or about November 11, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro, while on duty and for no police purpose, entered Las Tres Rosas Tavern, 3253 West Cermak Road, Chicago, Illinois, thereby entering any tavern or bar while on duty and/or in uniform.

Count III: On or about November 11, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro, while on duty and for no police purpose, entered Western Stages Tavern, 1853 South Western Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, thereby entering any tavern or bar while on duty and/or in uniform.

Count IV: On or about November 12, 2001, Police Officer Bill Caro, while on duty and for no police purpose, entered Las Tres Rosas Tavern, 3253 West Cermak Road, Chicago, Illinois, thereby entering any tavern or bar while on duty and/or in uniform.

11. Because of the five-year time-limit regarding use of a police officer's disciplinary history, included in section 8.4 of the contract between the Department of Police and the Fraternal Order of Police, the sustained complaint with an incident date of 7 June 1999 was not considered by the Police Board when making a decision as to the penalty in this case.

By reason of the fact that Police Officer Bill Caro, Star #3128, is guilty of violating Rules 2, 3, 5, 6, 10, and 16, cause exists for the suspension of Respondent from his position as a Police Officer with the Department of Police, and from the services of the City of Chicago, from 24 August 2004 to and including 15 July 2005.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Respondent, Police Officer Bill Caro, Star #3128, as a result of having been found guilty of charges in Police Board Case No. 04-2557, be and hereby is suspended from his position as a Police Officer with the Department of Police, and from the services of the City of Chicago, from 24 August 2004 to and including 15 July 2005.
