FINDINGS

On September 18, 2006, the Superintendent of Police filed with the Police Board of the City of Chicago charges against Police Officer Frederick Anthony, Star No. 9106 (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Respondent"), seeking his discharge for violating the following Rules of Conduct:

Rule 1: Violation of any law or ordinance.

Rule 2: Any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department.

Rule 9: Engaging in any unjustified verbal or physical altercation with any person, while on or off duty.

Rule 15: Intoxication on or off duty.

The Police Board caused a hearing on these charges against Police Officer Frederick Anthony to be had before Thomas E.

Johnson, Hearing Officer of the Police Board, on December 18,

2006, January 25, 2007, and February 21, 2007.

Following the hearing, the members of the Police Board read and reviewed the certified transcription of the hearing and viewed the video-recording of the hearing. Thomas E. Johnson, Hearing Officer, made an oral report to and conferred with the Police Board before it rendered a decision.

The Police Board of the City of Chicago, as a result of its hearing of the charges, finds and determines that:

- 1. The Respondent was at all times mentioned herein employed as a police officer by the Department of Police of the City of Chicago.
- 2. The charges were filed in writing and a Notice, stating the time, date, and place, when and where a hearing of the charges was to be held, together with a copy of the original charges, was served upon the Respondent more than five (5) days prior to the hearing on the charges.
- 3. The Respondent appeared throughout the hearing and was represented by legal counsel.
- 4. The Respondent, Police Officer Frederick Anthony, Star No. 9106, charged herein, is guilty of violating, to wit:

Rule 1: Violation of any law or ordinance.

Count V: On or about December 24, 2004, while off duty, he drove under the influence of alcohol in violation of 625 ILCS 5/11-501(a)(2).

Count VI: On or about December 24, 2004, while off duty, he drove while the alcohol concentration in his blood or breath was 0.08 or more, in violation of 625 ILCS 5/11-501(a)(1).

5. The Respondent, Police Officer Frederick Anthony, Star No. 9106, charged herein, is **not guilty** of violating, to wit:

Rule 1: Violation of any law or ordinance.

Count I: There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December 24, 2004, at approximately 2:03 a.m., in the vicinity of 12400 South Morgan Street, while off duty, he,

having been given a visual or audible signal by a peace officer directing him to bring his vehicle to a stop, willfully failed or refused to obey such direction, in violation of 625 ILCS 5/11-204.

Count II: There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December 24, 2004, at approximately 2:03 a.m., in the vicinity of 12400 South Morgan Street, while off duty, he operated a vehicle at a speed of approximately 85 miles per hour in a 25 miles per hour zone, in violation of 625 ILCS 5/11-601.5.

Count III: There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December 24, 2004, while off duty, he failed to stop at a stop sign at one or more of the following locations: 12400 South Morgan Street, 12400 South Throop Street, and 12400 South Ada Street, in violation of 625 ILCS 5/11-1204(b).

<u>Count IV</u>: There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December 24, 2004, while off duty, he committed reckless driving by driving a vehicle with a willful or wanton disregard for the safety of persons or property, in violation of 625 ILCS 5/11-503(a)(1).

<u>Count VII</u>: There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December 24, 2004, while off duty, he knowingly resisted or obstructed the performance of the authorized acts of Calumet Park police officers, in violation of 720 ILCS 5/31-1.

Count VIII: There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December 24, 2004, while off duty, he committed battery in that he intentionally or knowingly without legal justification caused bodily harm to or made physical contact of an insulting or provoking nature with Officer Mark Kozeluh and/or Officer Mark Kashirsky of the Calumet Park Police Department, in violation of 720 ILCS 5/12-3.

6. The Respondent, Police Officer Frederick Anthony, Star No. 9106, charged herein, is guilty of violating, to wit:

Rule 2: Any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department.

<u>Count V</u>: On or about December 24, 2004, while off duty, he drove a vehicle while under the influence of alcohol.

Count X: On or about December 24, 2004, he submitted to a Breathalyzer Test which disclosed that he had a blood alcohol content of 0.152.

<u>Count XI</u>: On or about June 16, 2005, he pled guilty to driving under the influence of alcohol and received two years court supervision.

- 7. The Respondent, Police Officer Frederick Anthony, Star
- No. 9106, charged herein, is not guilty of violating, to wit:
 - Rule 2: Any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department.

Count I: There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December 24, 2004, at approximately 2:03 a.m., in the vicinity of 12400 South Morgan Street, while off duty, he, having been given a visual or audible signal by a peace officer directing him to bring his vehicle to a stop, failed or refused to obey such direction.

<u>Count II</u>: There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December 24, 2004, at approximately 2:03 a.m., in the vicinity of 12400 South Morgan Street, while off duty, he operated a vehicle at a speed of approximately 85 miles per hour in a 25 miles per hour zone.

Count III: There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December 24, 2004, while off duty, he failed to stop at a stop sign at one or more of the following locations: 12400 South Morgan Street, 12400 South Throop Street, and 12400 South Ada Street.

<u>Count IV</u>: There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December

24, 2004, while off duty, he drove a vehicle with a disregard for the safety of persons or property.

<u>Count VI</u>: There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December 24, 2004, while off duty, he resisted or obstructed the performance of the authorized acts of one or more Calumet Park police officers.

Count VII: There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December 24, 2004, while off duty, he caused bodily harm to or made inappropriate physical contact with Officer Mark Kozeluh and/or Officer Mark Kashirsky of the Calumet Park Police Department.

Count VIII: There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December 24, 2004, while off duty, he used profanities or other inappropriate or offensive language, and/or made threats directed at one or more Calumet Park police officers, such as one or more of the following: "Fuck yeah I'm a cop, so fucking what?"; "What the fuck do you want?"; "You ain't cuffing me."; and "I've got you bitches now, you are going down for this."; or words to that effect.

Count IX: There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December 24, 2004, while off duty, he resisted Calumet Park police officers' attempts to handcuff him and/or take him into custody by doing one or more of the following: flailing his arms, pushing the officer(s), and thrashing his arms and legs while on the ground.

- 8. The Respondent, Police Officer Frederick Anthony, Star
- No. 9106, charged herein, is not guilty of violating, to wit:
 - Rule 8: Disrespect to or maltreatment of any person, while
 on or off duty.

There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December 24, 2004, while off duty, he used profanities or other inappropriate or offensive language, and/or made threats directed at one or more Calumet Park police officers, such as one or more of the following: "Fuck yeah I'm a cop, so fucking what?"; "What the fuck do

you want?"; "You ain't cuffing me."; and "I've got you bitches now, you are going down for this."; or words to that effect.

- 9. The Respondent, Police Officer Frederick Anthony, Star No. 9106, charged herein, is not guilty of violating, to wit:
 - Rule 9: Engaging in any unjustified verbal or physical altercation with any person, while on or off duty.

There was insufficient evidence presented by the Superintendent to prove that on or about December 24, 2004, while off duty, he resisted Calumet Park police officers' attempts to handcuff him and/or take him into custody by doing one or more of the following: flailing his arms, pushing the officer(s), and thrashing his arms and legs while on the ground.

10. The Respondent, Police Officer Frederick Anthony, Star No. 9106, charged herein, is guilty of violating, to wit:

Rule 15: Intoxication on or off duty.

On or about December 24, 2004, he submitted to a Breathalyzer Test which disclosed that he had a blood alcohol content of 0.152.

By reason of the findings of fact and guilt herein, cause exists for the suspension of the Respondent, Police Officer Frederick Anthony, Star No. 9106, from his position as a police officer with the Department of Police, and from the services of the City of Chicago, for a period of thirty (30) days, from September 20, 2006, to and including October 19, 2006.




