#### FINDINGS

On August 8, 2007, the Superintendent of Police filed with the Police Board of the City of Chicago charges against Police Officer Nathan Hicks, Star No. 16241 (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Respondent"), recommending that the Respondent be discharged from the Chicago Police Department for violating the following Rules of Conduct:

- <u>Rule 2</u>: Any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department;
- <u>Rule 3</u>: Any failure to promote the Department's efforts to implement its policy or accomplish its goals;
- <u>Rule 5</u>: Failure to perform any duty; and
- <u>Rule 11</u>: Incompetency or inefficiency in the performance of duty.

The Police Board caused a hearing on these charges against Police Officer Nathan Hicks to be had before Michael G. Berland, Hearing Officer of the Police Board, on April 14 and May 19, 2008.

Following the hearing, the members of the Police Board read and reviewed the record of proceedings and viewed the videorecording of the testimony of the witnesses. Michael G. Berland,

Hearing Officer, made an oral report to and conferred with the Police Board before it rendered a decision.

The Police Board of the City of Chicago, as a result of its hearing of the charges, finds and determines that:

 The Respondent was at all times mentioned herein employed as a police officer by the Department of Police of the City of Chicago.

2. The charges were filed in writing and a Notice, stating the time, date, and place, when and where a hearing of the charges was to be held, together with a copy of the original charges, were served upon the Respondent more than five (5) days prior to the hearing on the charges.

3. The Respondent appeared throughout the hearing and was represented by legal counsel.

4. The Respondent, Police Officer Nathan Hicks, Star No. 16241, charged herein, is **guilty** of violating, to wit:

<u>Rule 2</u>: Any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department,

in that:

On or about June 3, 2006, Police Officer Hicks, when faced with a deadly-force situation at Dominick's Food Store, located at or near 2101 East 71<sup>st</sup> Street, Chicago, in which the offender, James King, drew a gun, failed to respond with the appropriate use of force and/or failed to engage the threat by retreating from the threat.

5. The Respondent, Police Officer Nathan Hicks, Star No. 16241, charged herein, is **guilty** of violating, to wit:

<u>Rule 3</u>: Any failure to promote the Department's efforts to implement its policy or accomplish its goals,

in that:

On or about June 3, 2006, Police Officer Hicks, when faced with a deadly-force situation at Dominick's Food Store, located at or near 2101 East 71<sup>st</sup> Street, Chicago, in which the offender, James King, drew a gun, failed to respond with the appropriate use of force and/or failed to engage the threat by retreating from the threat.

6. The Respondent, Police Officer Nathan Hicks, Star No. 16241, charged herein, is **guilty** of violating, to wit:

Rule 5: Failure to perform any duty,

in that:

On or about June 3, 2006, Police Officer Hicks, when faced with a deadly-force situation at Dominick's Food Store, located at or near 2101 East 71<sup>st</sup> Street, Chicago, in which the offender, James King, drew a gun, failed to respond with the appropriate use of force and/or failed to engage the threat by retreating from the threat.

7. The Respondent, Police Officer Nathan Hicks, Star No. 16241, charged herein, is **guilty** of violating, to wit:

<u>Rule 11</u>: Incompetency or inefficiency in the performance of duty,

in that:

On or about June 3, 2006, Police Officer Hicks, when faced with a deadly-force situation at Dominick's Food Store, located at or near 2101 East 71<sup>st</sup> Street, Chicago, in which the offender, James King, drew a gun, failed to respond with the appropriate use of force and/or failed to engage the threat by retreating from the threat, thereby failing to utilize the tactics that were taught to him in his training at the Education and Training Academy.

By reason of the findings of fact and guilt set forth herein, cause exists for the discharge of the Respondent, Police Officer Nathan Hicks, Star No. 16241, from his position as a

police officer with the Department of Police, and from the services of the City of Chicago.






