## FINDINGS

On January 27, 2009, the Superintendent of Police filed with the Police Board of the City of Chicago charges against Crossing Guard Linda Norwood, Employee No. 18193 (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Respondent"), recommending that the Respondent be discharged from the Chicago Police Department for violating the following Rules of Conduct:

Rule 1: Violation of any law or ordinance.

Rule 2: Any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department.

Rule 8: Disrespect to or maltreatment of any person,
while on or off duty.

The Police Board caused a hearing on these charges against Crossing Guard Linda Norwood to be had before Michael G.

Berland, Hearing Officer of the Police Board, on August 12 and September 15, 2009.

Following the hearing, the members of the Police Board read and reviewed the record of proceedings and viewed the videorecording of the testimony of the witnesses. Michael G.

Berland, Hearing Officer, made an oral report to and conferred with the Police Board before it rendered a decision.

The Police Board of the City of Chicago, as a result of its hearing of the charges, finds and determines that:

- 1. The Respondent was at all times mentioned herein employed as a crossing guard by the Department of Police of the City of Chicago.
- 2. The charges were filed in writing and a Notice, stating the time, date, and place, when and where a hearing of the charges was to be held, together with a copy of the original charges, were served upon the Respondent more than five (5) days prior to the hearing on the charges.
- 3. The Respondent appeared throughout the hearing, except for closing arguments on September 15, 2009, and was represented by a union representative.
- 4. The Respondent, Crossing Guard Linda Norwood, Employee No. 18193, charged herein, is **guilty** of violating, to wit:

Rule 1: Violation of any law or ordinance, in that:

Count I: On or about January 10, 2007, at or about 4011 West Jackson Boulevard, Chicago, she willfully allowed her minor son, Darian Norwood, to live in filthy and deplorable conditions that endangered his life and/or health—to wit, conditions including a residence filled with urine-soaked mattresses and piles of clothing, and/or a refrigerator with no edible food and mold inside—in violation of Chapter 720 ILCS 5/12-21.6(a).

Count II: On or about January 10, 2007, at or about 4011 West Jackson Boulevard, Chicago, she willfully

allowed her minor son, Timothy Norwood, to live in filthy and deplorable conditions that endangered his life and/or health—to wit, conditions including a residence filled with urine-soaked mattresses and piles of clothing, and/or a refrigerator with no edible food and mold inside—in violation of Chapter 720 ILCS 5/12-21.6(a).

- 5. The Respondent, Crossing Guard Linda Norwood, Employee No. 18193, charged herein, is **guilty** of violating, to wit:
  - Rule 2: Any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department,

## in that:

Count I: On or about January 10, 2007, at or about 4011 West Jackson Boulevard, Chicago, she willfully allowed her minor son, Darian Norwood, to live in filthy and deplorable conditions that endangered his life and/or health—to wit, conditions including a residence filled with the odor of urine and/or feces, and/or mattresses soaked with urine, and/or rodent infestation, and/or a moldy refrigerator with no edible food inside—thereby impeding the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals and/or bringing discredit upon the Department.

Count II: On or about January 10, 2007, at or about 4011 West Jackson Boulevard, Chicago, she willfully allowed her minor son, Timothy Norwood, to live in filthy and deplorable conditions that endangered his life and/or health—to wit, conditions including a residence filled with the odor of urine and/or feces, and/or mattresses soaked with urine, and/or rodent infestation, and/or a moldy refrigerator with no edible food inside—thereby impeding the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals and/or bringing discredit upon the Department.

Count III: On or about January 10, 2007, in the Circuit Court of Cook County, Chicago, she was charged criminally with two counts of endangering the life or health of a child, thereby impeding the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals and/or bringing discredit upon the Department.

Count IV: On or about August 9, 2007, in the Circuit Court of Cook County, Chicago, she pled guilty to and was found guilty of endangering the life or health of a child, thereby impeding the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals and/or bringing discredit upon the Department

6. The Respondent, Crossing Guard Linda Norwood, Employee No. 18193, charged herein, is **guilty** of violating, to wit:

Rule 8: Disrespect to or maltreatment of any person,
while on or off duty,

## in that:

Count I: On or about January 10, 2007, at or about 4011 West Jackson Boulevard, Chicago, she willfully allowed her minor son, Darian Norwood, to live in filthy and deplorable conditions that endangered his life and/or health—to wit, conditions including a residence filled with the odor of urine and/or feces, and/or mattresses soaked with urine, and/or rodent infestation, and/or a moldy refrigerator with no edible food inside.

Count II: On or about January 10, 2007, at or about 4011 West Jackson Boulevard, Chicago, she willfully allowed her minor son, Timothy Norwood, to live in filthy and deplorable conditions that endangered his life and/or health—to wit, conditions including a residence filled with the odor of urine and/or feces, and/or mattresses soaked with urine, and/or rodent infestation, and/or a moldy refrigerator with no edible food inside.

By reason of the findings of fact and guilt set forth herein, cause exists for the discharge of the Respondent, Crossing Guard Linda Norwood, Employee No. 18193, from her position as a crossing guard with the Department of Police, and from the services of the City of Chicago.






