

CHARGES AGAINST POLICE OFFICER AMY B. MCGRATH

Police Officer Amy B. McGrath, Star No. 14907, is charged with violating the following rules contained in Article V of the Rules and Regulations of the Chicago Police Department, which were in full force and effect on the date of the alleged violations:

- Rule 1: Violation of any law or ordinance.
- Rule 2: Any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department.
- Rule 6: Disobedience of an order or directive, whether written or oral.


SPECIFICATIONS

1. On or about March 9, 2015, Officer Amy B. McGrath reported to the Chicago Police Department's Random Drug Testing Unit at or about 3510 South Michigan Avenue, Chicago, Illinois and submitted a urine specimen under Control Number DA157091A, which subsequently tested positive for 6-Acetylmorphine, a heroin metabolite. Officer McGrath thereby violated:
 - a. Rule 1, which prohibits violation of any law or ordinance, by violating section 402 of the Illinois Controlled Substances Act (720 ILCS 570/402 (West 2010)) when she knowingly possessed heroin, a controlled substance, on and/or prior to March 9, 2015.
 - b. Rule 2, which prohibits any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department.
 - c. Rule 6, which prohibits disobedience of an order or directive, whether written or oral, when she disobeyed Chicago Police Department Employee Resource E01-09, section II(B), which prohibits the use of illegal drugs, cannabis, or non-prescribed controlled substances or the abuse of legally prescribed drugs or controlled substances by any Department member.

2. On or about March 9, 2015, Officer Amy B. McGrath reported to the Chicago Police Department's Random Drug Testing Unit at or about 3510 South Michigan Avenue, Chicago, Illinois and submitted a urine specimen under Control Number DA157091A, which subsequently tested positive for morphine. Officer McGrath thereby violated:
 - a. Rule 1, which prohibits violation of any law or ordinance, by violating section 402 of the Illinois Controlled Substances Act (720 ILCS 570/402 (West 2010)) when she knowingly possessed morphine, a controlled substance, without a valid prescription on and/or prior to March 9, 2015.
 - b. Rule 2, which prohibits any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department.
 - c. Rule 6, which prohibits disobedience of an order or directive, whether written or oral, when she disobeyed Chicago Police Department Employee Resource E01-09, section II(B), which prohibits the use of illegal drugs, cannabis, or non-prescribed controlled substances or the abuse of legally prescribed drugs or controlled substances by any Department member.


3. On or about March 9, 2015, Officer Amy B. McGrath reported to the Chicago Police Department's Random Drug Testing Unit at or about 3510 South Michigan Avenue, Chicago, Illinois and submitted a urine specimen under Control Number DA157091A, which subsequently tested positive for codeine. Officer McGrath thereby violated:
 - a. Rule 1, which prohibits violation of any law or ordinance, by violating section 402 of the Illinois Controlled Substances Act (720 ILCS 570/402 (West 2010)) when she knowingly possessed codeine, a controlled substance, without a valid prescription on and/or prior to March 9, 2015.
 - b. Rule 2, which prohibits any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department.
 - c. Rule 6, which prohibits disobedience of an order or directive, whether written or oral, when she disobeyed Chicago Police Department Employee Resource E01-09, section II(B), which prohibits the use of illegal drugs, cannabis, or non-prescribed controlled substances or the abuse of legally prescribed drugs or controlled substances by any Department member.

Based on the foregoing charges and specifications, the Superintendent recommends that Amy B. McGrath, Star No. 14907, be discharged from the Chicago Police Department.
