## FINDINGS & DECISION

On January 13,1998, the Superintendent of Police filed charges with the Police Board of the City of Chicago against Police Officer Milton Storey, Star #8622, (hereinafter sometimes referred to as ("Respondent") seeking the separation of the Respondent for violating the following Rules:

Rule 1: Violation of any law or ordinance.

Rule 2: Any action or conduct which impedes the Department's efforts to achieve its policy and goals or brings discredit upon the Department.

Rule 8: Disrespect to or maltreatment of any person, while on or off duty.

The Police Board of the City of Chicago caused a hearing on these charges against Police Officer Milton Storey to be had before Michael G. Berland, Hearing Officer of the Police Board of the City of Chicago on August 6, 1998, September 15, 1998, and September 28, 1998.

Following the hearing, the members of the Police Board read and reviewed the certified transcription of the proceedings of the hearing. Michael G. Berland, Hearing Officer, made a report and conferred with the Police Board before it rendered a decision.

The Police Board of the City of Chicago, as a result of its

investigation of the charges, finds and determines that:

- 1. The Respondent was at all times a Police Officer employed by the Department of Police of the City of Chicago.
- 2. The charges were filed in writing and a Notice, stating the time, date and place, when and where a hearing of the charges was to be held, together with a copy of the original charges, was served upon the Respondent more than five (5) days prior to the hearing on the charges.
- 3. The hearing was conducted before Michael G. Berland,

  August 6, 1998, September 15, 1998, and September 28, 1998.
- 4. Throughout the hearing the Respondent did appear in

Rule 1: Violation of any law or ordinance.

- A. On or about January 23, 1997, Officer Storey did not obtain or exert unauthorized control over property owned by Abdul Muhammed, including one coat and one shoe, or do any act to violate 720 ILCS 5/16-1 (a)(1).
- B. On or about January 23, 1997, Officer Storey did not strike Abdul Muhammad on the face and the head with a gun, nor did he cause bodily harm to him or make any contact with Muhammad of an insulting or provoking nature, or do any act to violate 720 ILCS '12-3(a).

- 7. The Respondent Police Officer Milton Storey, Star #8622, charged herein, contrary to the Rules and Regulations, is not guilty of violating, to wit:
- A. On or about January 23, 1997, Officer Storey did not disrespect Abdul Muhammad by saying "This is for fucking with my car."
- B. On or about January 23, 1997, Officer Storey did not disrespect and maltreat Abdul Muhammad by striking Muhammad on the face and head with a gun, or cause any bodily harm, or making any physical contact of an insulting or provoking nature.
- 8. The Board denied the Respondent's Motion To Bar Certain testimony. That testimony was admissible as an excited utterance.

By reason of the fact that Officer Milton Storey, Star #8622 is not guilty of violating Rules 1, 2, and 8 the Police Board orders that Officer Storey be reinstated to his position as a Police Officer with the Department Of Police of the City Of Chicago effective January 14, 1998 with restoration of all rights and benefits.
